YOUTH SUBSTANCE USE PREVENTION

EVIDENCE-BASED PREVENTION EDUCATION

Using a two-way approach to teaching important life skills involved in making healthy choices and resisting the pressure to use drugs, YSUP uses evidence-based curriculum, recommended and approved as effective by the HHSC.

Sessions are approximately 45 minutes in length, and are designed to be conducted on a consecutive weekly or bi-weekly basis, in schools and communitybased settings. In schools, students attend sessions during elective classes, as to not interfere with their primary academics.

Youth Prevention Universal

Efforts are aimed at delaying or preventing the onset of risky behaviors within the general youth population.

ALL STARS CORE : AGES 11-13

All Stars Core Curriculum is a fun and highly interactive program that has been proven to prevent substance use, and other negative high-risk behaviors like fighting, bullying, and delinquency. The program includes small group activities, discussions, games, and art.

Youth Prevention Selective

Efforts target youth who are considered "at risk' for future behavioral health problems, including substance abuse, delinquency, and violence.

KIDS' CONNECTION : AGES 4-12 YOUTH CONNECTION : AGES 10-17

This is a Curriculum-Based Support Group (CBSG) by Rainbow Days. Participants meet in confidential small group settings, learning how to cope with difficult family situations, resist negative peer pressure, respect others, set/achieve goals, make healthy choices, and refuse alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.
